Chicago

This year's headliner band, Chicago, is an all-American rock band that has been captivating audiences since its formation in 1967. Chicago has since become one of the longest running and most successful American rock bands, with 38 million units sold throughout its 46-year history. Gathering a fan base devoted to their rock hits and moving power ballads, the band has compiled five number one albums and 21 top-ten singles.

Recently, Chicago has toured with a multitude of musical acts, including The Beach Boys; the Doobie Brothers; and Earth, Wind, and Fire. Chicago has also performed on popular television shows such as *American Idol*.

Throughout 2013, Chicago has been busy recording tracks for a new album.

The Josh Krajcik Band

An Ohio native, Josh Krajcik originally hails from Wooster; however, his rich and unique voice, coupled with his signature striking musical blend of rock and roll, soul and a touch of R&B, has introduced Krajcik and his band to a nation of devoted followers.

After several years as a solo artist, Josh Krajcik was introduced to Mitch Pinkston (bass) and Corey Gillen (drums), both local Ohio students and residents. The band recorded its first album, "Ghosts" (2005), in Columbus, Ohio. Since then, the Josh Krajcik Band has opened for various artists on tour, including Corinne Bailey Rae, Brandi Carlile and The Fray.

In 2011, Josh Krajcik was the runner-up in the first season of *The X Factor USA*. Earlier this year, Josh Krajcik released his fourth disk entitled "Blindly, Lonely, Lovely."

The Emerald City Swing Orchestra

The Emerald City Swing Orchestra is a 17-piece community music group. Made up entirely of members from the community, including many Dublin City Schools music teachers, the orchestra specializes in performing an extensive repertoire of classic and contemporary jazz and swing compositions. Since its formation in 2001, the Emerald City Swing Orchestra has become a community favorite, offering a unique musical experience by playing a variety of jazz favorites, both old and new.
